PLAN YOUR DAY

1. Our schools and colleges will give presentations at different locations across campus at 10 a.m. following registration. You'll learn about degree programs of interest and discover the specific advantages that come with earning a degree through our renowned schools and colleges. You'll also have a chance to hear from an Undergraduate Admissions representative to learn more about our admission process and how to apply.
2. Be sure to check out our student resource presentations and activities. Certain presentations run throughout the day, while others are only offered at one time. Presentations are 30 minutes long unless otherwise noted. 
