**Definitions**

**Homeless** - A student is considered homeless if he lacks fixed, regular, and adequate housing. This is broader than just living “on the street.” It includes but is not limited to: youth sharing housing with other people temporarily because they had nowhere else to go; youth living in emergency or transitional shelters, for example, trailers provided by the Federal Emergency Management Agency after disasters; youth living in motels, campgrounds, cars, parks, abandoned buildings, bus or train stations, substandard housing, or any public or private place not designed for humans to live in; youth living in the school dormitory if they would otherwise be homeless; and youth who are migrants and who qualify as experiencing homeless because they are living in circumstances described above. It also includes living in campus housing if the student would otherwise be homeless. A student living in any of these situations and fleeing an abusive parent may be considered homeless even if the parent would provide support and a place to live.

**Unaccompanied** - When a student is not living in the physical custody of a parent or guardian.

**Youth** - Any student who is not yet 24 may qualify for a homeless youth determination.

**Self-Supporting** - When a student pays for their own living expenses, including fixed, regular and adequate housing.

**At risk of being homeless** - When a student’s housing may cease to be fixed, regular and adequate, for example, a student who is being evicted and has been unable to find fixed, regular and adequate housing.

**Role - check applicable role:**

- School district homeless liaison, or designee of the liaison, as designated by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act.

- Director or a designee of a director of a program funded under TRIO or GEAR UP.
- A financial aid administrator at another institution who previously made a homeless youth determination.

**This form conveys my determination that any time since July 1, 2023, the above-named student was:**

- An unaccompanied homeless youth, as defined by the FAFSA Simplification Act (Public Law No: 116-260).
- An unaccompanied, self-supporting youth at risk of homelessness.

I am authorized to document this student’s living situation and determine his/her independent student status as an unaccompanied homeless youth, or an unaccompanied, self-supporting youth at risk of homelessness. Financial aid administrators must accept this documentation unless there is specific documented conflicting information.
