In November, a team of WSU staff attended the National Learning Community Conference (NLCC) in Indianapolis. This team provided three different presentations during the conference. Additionally, Amy Cooper (Manager of the Learning Community Program) began her term as the secretary for the Learning Community Association Council. We hope to continue to take teams of LC coordinators and peer mentors to NLCC. With the 2020 conference cancelled, we have lots of time to plan and prepare presentations for the next NLCC in 2021.

In January, we hosted Learning Community Pitch Days with the help of campus partners from University Advising, Career Services, the Student Service Center, Housing and Residential Life, and the Office for Teaching and Learning. # New Learning Communities for 2020-2021!

Environmental Sciences and Sustainability – Coordinated by Donna Kashian, Elena Past, Chris Steiner, and Darryl Pierson The Environmental Sciences and Sustainability Learning Community is for students in the Ecology and the Environment (BIO 3500) course but is especially designed for students seeking deeper exposure to issues in environmental science and sustainability. Members of the learning community will deepen their understanding of urban sustainability and have opportunities to expand their networks through interaction with practitioners in the greater urban Detroit community.

Jewish Studies – Coordinated by Howard Lupovitch
The Jewish Studies Learning Community is open to all students, those in
Jewish Studies courses and otherwise. We will be offering two types of
learning opportunities. First, for students in Jewish Studies courses – Jewish
History, Hebrew, Israeli Culture and Society – there will be an opportunity to
participate learning events that will complement the course. For students not
enrolled in a Jewish Studies course, there will be learning events on a variety
of topics that will be determined by student interests.

## **School of Medicine: Physicians in Training** – Coordinated by LaToya Sherman and Eric Ayers

Through the development of robust and complementary Peer Mentor and Mentee relationships, the new School of Medicine: Physicians in Training Learning Community paves a smooth path in the transition from undergrad to medical education. The program brings all four classes of medical students together through social engagement activities and its subject based curriculum "meet-ups" that are centered on discussions regarding Detroit's top health disparities and particular issues that physicians face.

**Social Work Peer Support (SWPS)** – Coordinated by Judith Wineman This learning community was created to connect social work students with peer mentors in their academic program (BSW and MSW). The SWPS LC creates opportunities for students to support other students as well as build a stronger student community within the School of Social Work.

**Transcending Equity in Mathematics for Pre-Elementary School Teachers (TEMPEST)** – Coordinated by Shawntae Harris Mintline and Len Hernandez

TEMPEST was created to support students pursuing elementary or special education majors who are working through their mathematics sequence. This LC will help students understand the mathematics as they transition from a mathematics student to a teacher of mathematics.
