# <u>Learning Communities</u> Jumping into the New Year

Welcome back Learning Community Family! Happy Fall semester! We have had an exciting and enriching summer, preparing for this new academic year, and we are very ready to work with each of you to make this semester an impactful one.

In June, I was able to take a team of LC Coordinators to participate in the AAC&U Institute for High Impact Practices in Student Success. Kenya Swanson from Warrior VIP, Tonya Whitehead from Office for Teaching & Learning/WIDER, and Roxana Zuniga from Spanish, and I spent a week together, drafting a plan to increase HIP characteristics across the Learning Community Program, and to inventory other HIPs across campus. Jule Thomas from Composition/WRT Zone is also an integral part of this team. I am starting a pilot program with these LCs this fall, to determine processes and next steps of this plan for the larger LC family. Stay tuned for more detail in the coming months.

On July 1, the LC Program (myself, Project Coordinator Amy Novotny, and Student Assistant Lela Jimenez) moved our offices from FAB to the Academic Success Center, suite 1600 UGL. This move will allow our team to continue to support learning communities across the campus and to leverage collaborations with campus partners, to continue to support the development of peer mentors campus-wide, to promote the use of high impact practices and to positively affect the persistence of all students. We are eagerly awaiting the arrival of furniture from the WSU warehouse; once we are settled we are planning an OPEN HOUSE to show off our new space in the ASC.

We have been working closely with Housing and Residential Life to increase support and connection for our Living Learning Communities. Katie Turner is Community Director in the Thompson Home, and is the newly appointed Academic Initiatives Coordinator for Housing and Residential Life. We are collaborating on LLC "lesson plans" which will potentially become the framework for future LLC event planning.

We have been meeting with Dean of Students Office regarding the GetInvolved platform, to increase access and support to LCs through existing technology. This fall, a test group of LCs will be enrolled in a new facet of GetInvolved, to gauge effectiveness in support of LC programming, with the hope of incorporating all LCs by next semester.
