

About WayneDirect

WayneDirect is a program for currently enrolled Henry Ford Community College students who are interested in transferring to Wayne State University to earn a bachelor's degree. The program provides Henry Ford Community College students opportunities to learn more about Wayne State University academic programs, to participate in campus events and activities and to obtain early admission to Wayne State University. Through WayneDirect, students can avail themselves of special services that will assist them in their transition to Wayne State and increase their likelihood for success. Eligible participants include any currently enrolled Henry Ford Community College student and recent high school graduates who have enrolled in courses at Henry Ford Community College.

Students are encouraged to apply for WayneDirect in their first semesters at Henry Ford Community College. This is to ensure that the WayneDirect student can fully benefit from the program and make a smooth transition to Wayne State. At the completion of the WayneDirect program, and at the time of transfer to Wayne State, the WayneDirect student will have a minimum of 50 credit hours completed and/or an associate degree. Additionally, the student will have a minimum 2.0 grade-point average. WayneDirect students have the opportunity to apply for Wayne State scholarships at the time of transfer to Wayne State.

WayneDirect does not ensure admission to professional programs or other degree programs with special admission criteria. WayneDirect students who complete the program and are interested in applying to a professional program or other degree program with special admission criteria must complete the application process for that particular program but will not need to file an Undergraduate Admissions Application.

Benefits of WayneDirect

- **Early Admission** WayneDirect participants are guaranteed admission to Wayne State provided they meet the requirements of the WayneDirect program; a minimum cumulative 2.0 grade-point average and 50 credit hours of post-secondary work or an associate degree. These requirements must be met upon completion of the program and at the time of transfer to Wayne State. The WayneDirect application is the only application participants need to complete to transfer to Wayne State.
- **Bridge Sessions** These sessions will help familiarize WayneDirect participants with all of the resources Wayne State offers. Participants have direct contact with academic advisers and other key resources on campus during the sessions.
- **Transfer Plans** WayneDirect students will have access to regularly updated transfer plans specific to their intended major. Before enrolling at Wayne State, participants will receive an official transfer credit evaluation to assist in planning for course selection. - **Wayne State Libraries** Wayne State will make the full resources of the library system available to WayneDirect students to conduct research, prepare papers and use as needed. For more information on WayneDirect library services, visit www.lib.wayne.edu/students/waynedirect.php.
- **OneCard** WayneDirect participants will be provided a Wayne State OneCard, a multipurpose identification and debit card. The OneCard can be used for parking, library services, copying and printing services and at food venues. OneCard holders can receive discounts at local businesses by showing their OneCard at the time of purchase.
- **Fitness Facility** Work out and stay in shape at the Matthaei Athletic Complex. WayneDirect students can use this athletic facility by showing their OneCard. The athletic complex has basketball and racquetball courts, an open weight room and an Olympic-size swimming pool.
- **Academic Resources** Tap in to Wayne State's academic and career resources. Students will have opportunities to meet with academic advisers in their academic area of interest and attend workshops and presentations at the Writing Center. Participants also can access Wayne State's Academic Success Center for tutoring and success workshops. The Career Service's staff can assist WayneDirect students in their career development through career counseling, resume workshops and mock interviews.
- **Special Events** WayneDirect participants have access to Wayne State student activities and events. Meet Wayne State students and enjoy campus life at these events.

Procedure to Apply

- Students interested in participating in the program should complete a WayneDirect application and have official transcripts sent from all educational institutions attended. There is no WayneDirect application fee.
- In addition to completing a WayneDirect application, all students must submit verification of enrollment from Henry Ford Community College. Enrollment can be verified by the Registration Office at Henry Ford Community College. *Use the enrollment verification form on the application.*

Procedure to Apply cont.

- Once in the **WayneDirect** program, students must earn a minimum of 50 total credit hours and are strongly encouraged to complete an associate degree at Henry Ford Community College.
- **WayneDirect** is designed for students just starting their college careers and therefore is only open to those who have earned fewer than 50 total credit hours. Students with more than 50 credits or an associate degree can apply as transfer students to Wayne State University by completing the Undergraduate Admissions Application. These students must follow all instructions for a transfer student and meet the minimum transfer admission requirements.

- If a student wants to take classes at Wayne State University while enrolled at Henry Ford Community College, the student should call the Wayne State Office of Undergraduate Admissions at (313) 577-3577.

Notes:

- Due to NCAA regulations, student athletes are not eligible for the **WayneDirect** program.
- International students on an F-1 visa are not eligible for the **WayneDirect** program.
- If a student has already attended Wayne State University, the student should contact the Wayne State Office of Records and Registration to update his or her information. The student should not complete a new Wayne State University application.

FERPA Release

Students' educational information is released subject to the confidentiality provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and other appropriate state and federal laws and regulations, which prohibit disclosure of educational information without the specific written consent of the person to whom it pertains or as otherwise permitted.

WayneDirect students will authorize the sharing of educational and university directory information between Henry Ford Community College and Wayne State University as designated on the **WayneDirect** application. Frequently Asked Questions

When can I participate in WayneDirect?

WayneDirect is designed for students just starting their college careers and therefore is only open to those who have earned fewer than 50 credits total at any institutions they have attended. Students with more than a total of 50 credits who have an associate degree can apply as transfer students to Wayne State University by completing the Undergraduate Admissions Application.

How do I complete the WayneDirect program?

Once you finish 50 total credit hours of coursework from all institutions you have attended and/or you receive your associate degree, you can enroll in courses at Wayne State University. WayneDirect participants must submit their final official transcripts to the WSU Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Students must also have a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade-point average at the time of transfer to meet the current WSU requirements.

Can I transfer to Wayne State before I finish the WayneDirect program?

Yes. Students who choose to transfer before completing the program must complete an Undergraduate Admissions Application and pay the \$30 application fee.

Is there an application fee for WayneDirect?

No. There is no application fee for WayneDirect. However, if you choose to transfer to Wayne State before you complete the WayneDirect program, you must fill out an Undergraduate Admissions Application and pay the \$30 fee for the application.

As a WayneDirect participant, am I considered to be a dual enrolled student?

No. WayneDirect is not a joint enrollment program. It is designed to assist students at Henry Ford Community College in making a smooth transition to the university by providing them access to academic resources. WayneDirect participants will not enroll in courses at Wayne

State until they have completed the program.

How can I find out more on WayneDirect?

You can visit admissions.wayne.edu/waynedirect for more information or pick up a WayneDirect brochure at the University Transfer, Advising and Career Counseling Office at HFCC or in the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at WSU.

Can I enroll in courses at Wayne State through WayneDirect?

Not automatically. WayneDirect is designed to allow prospective transfer students the opportunity to access campus services and resources. It does not give students the ability to enroll in courses at Wayne State while remaining at Henry Ford Community College. However, if WayneDirect students want to enroll in courses at Wayne State, they must contact the Office of Undergraduate Admissions at (313) 577-3577 to find out under which status they should apply.

If I participate in WayneDirect and receive my associate degree, will all of my General Education courses be fulfilled?

No. Completing an appropriate associate degree (or having the MACRAO-stamped transcript) will not guarantee that all general education requirements are fulfilled. You must speak with your academic adviser to determine which general education requirements can be fulfilled for your specific major or program.
