

What is WayneDirect?

WayneDirect gives Macomb Community College students the ability to concurrently enroll in classes at Wayne State University. This streamlining of the admissions process offers students the greatest amount of flexibility possible while completing their bachelor's degree. Once admitted, students can register for classes or they can choose to take advantage of their early admission status by accessing resources on Wayne State's campus and facilities. Through **WayneDirect**, participants can use special services that will assist them in their transition to Wayne State and increase their likelihood for success. Eligible participants include any currently enrolled Macomb Community College students and recent high school graduates who have enrolled in courses at Macomb.

Students are encouraged to apply for **WayneDirect** early in their college career. This is to ensure that the **WayneDirect** participant can fully benefit from the program and make a smooth transition to Wayne State. Students are encouraged to complete their associate degree at Macomb Community College during the program.

WayneDirect does not ensure admission to professional programs or other degree programs with special admission criteria. **WayneDirect** participants who complete the program and are interested in applying to a professional program or other degree program with special admission criteria must complete the application process for that particular program, but will not need to file an Undergraduate Admissions Application.

Benefits of WayneDirect

- **Early Admission** **WayneDirect** participants are guaranteed admission to Wayne State provided they meet the minimum requirements for undergraduate admissions:
 - a 2.0 cumulative grade-point average for transfer students
 - or a 2.75 grade-point average with ACT or SAT scores submitted for freshman; or a 2.0 – 2.74 grade-point average with 21 composite ACT or 990 SAT score submitted for recent high school graduates.

- **Concurrent Enrollment** **WayneDirect** Macomb Community College participants can concurrently enroll in courses at Macomb and Wayne State through the program. Many Wayne State courses are offered at Macomb University Center for the student's convenience. Participants interested in concurrent enrollment should contact the Wayne State Office of Undergraduate Admissions.
- **Financial Aid** Maximize your financial aid eligibility by combining courses from both institutions to achieve full enrollment status, which often qualifies financial aid applicants for more assistance.
- **Live on campus** Wayne State's on-campus residence halls provide you with a great place to live while you are taking classes. **WayneDirect** students must be enrolled full time (12 credit hours) each semester to take advantage of this benefit. Credit hours will be calculated based on total combined credits from both institutions. All **WayneDirect** students who choose to live in the residence halls must follow all Wayne State rules and procedures. Visit housing.wayne.edu to check out your living options..
- **Bridge Sessions** These sessions will help familiarize **WayneDirect** participants with all of the resources Wayne State offers. Participants have direct contact with academic advisers and other key resources on campus during the sessions.
- **Transfer Plans** **WayneDirect** participants will have access to regularly updated transfer plans specific to their intended major. Before enrolling at Wayne State, participants will receive an official transfer credit evaluation to assist in planning for course selection. - **Wayne State Libraries** Wayne State will make the full resources of the library system available to **WayneDirect** participants to conduct research, prepare papers and use as needed. For more information on **WayneDirect** library services, visit www.lib.wayne.edu/students/waynedirect.php.
- **OneCard** **WayneDirect** participants will be provided a Wayne State OneCard, a multipurpose

identification and debit card. The OneCard can be used for parking, library services, copying and printing services and at food venues. OneCard holders can receive discounts at local businesses by showing their OneCard at the time of purchase.

- **Academic Resources** Tap in to Wayne State's academic and career resources. Students will have opportunities to meet with academic advisers in their academic area of interest and attend the Writing Center's workshops and presentations covering the writing process. **WayneDirect** participants can access Wayne State's Academic Success Center for tutoring and success workshops. Wayne State's Career Services staff can assist **WayneDirect** participants in their career development through career counseling, resume workshops and mock interviews.
- **Fitness Facility** Work out and stay in shape at the Matthaehi Athletic Complex. **WayneDirect** participants can use this athletic facility by showing their OneCard. The athletic complex has basketball and racquetball courts, an open weight room and an Olympic-size swimming pool.
- **Special Events** **WayneDirect** participants have access to Wayne State student activities and events, where they can meet Wayne State students and enjoy campus life.

Procedure to Apply

- Students interested in applying should complete a **WayneDirect** application and have official transcripts sent from all educational institutions attended. There is no **WayneDirect** application fee.
- The **WayneDirect** application is the only application participants need to complete to transfer to Wayne State.
- All **WayneDirect** applicants must be admitted to Macomb Community College.
- **WayneDirect** is designed for students just starting their college careers and therefore is only open to those who have earned fewer than 50 total credit hours. Students with more than 50 credits or an associate

degree can apply as transfer students to Wayne State University by completing the Undergraduate Admissions Application. These students must follow all instructions for a transfer student and meet the minimum transfer admission requirements.

- If a student wants to take classes at Wayne State University while enrolled at Macomb Community College, the student should call the Wayne State University Office of Undergraduate Admissions at (313) 577-3577.

Notes:

- Due to NCAA regulations, student athletes are not eligible for the **WayneDirect** program.
- Student athletes involved with club sports are not eligible for **WayneDirect**.

- International students on an F-1 visa are not eligible for the **WayneDirect** program.
- If a student has already attended Wayne State University, the student should contact the Wayne State Office of Records and Registration to update his or her information. The student should not complete a new Wayne State University application.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

- Financial aid will be available for qualified students enrolled at both institutions. Student data, compliance information and end-of-term information will be shared between schools.
- Students who enroll exclusively at Macomb or Wayne State University in a given term will receive financial aid directly from that institution.

- Students who enroll at both Macomb Community College and Wayne State University in a given term will have financial aid calculated on their combined credit hours. Students can only receive financial aid from Wayne State University.
- **WayneDirect** participants who apply for financial aid will sign a student financial aid contract each semester that will help guide both institutions.
- **WayneDirect** participants enrolled at Macomb and Wayne State can apply for private scholarships at their respective institutions. Scholarships can be used for costs at the institutions awarding the scholarship.
- The partnering institutions have differing business practices. Please consult each institution regarding tuition and fee payment schedule.

Frequently Asked Questions

When can I participate in WayneDirect?

WayneDirect is designed for students just starting their college careers and therefore is only open to those who have earned fewer than 50 total credit hours at any institutions they have attended. Students with more than a total of 50 credits or who have an associate degree can apply as transfer students to Wayne State University by completing the Undergraduate Admissions Application.

Is there an application fee for WayneDirect?

No. There is no application fee for WayneDirect.

As a Macomb WayneDirect participant, can I concurrently enroll at Wayne State?

Yes. Macomb WayneDirect participants are able to enroll in courses at both institutions. WayneDirect is designed to assist students at Macomb Community College in making a smooth transition to the university by providing them access to academic resources.

If I participate in WayneDirect and receive my associate degree, will all of my General Education courses be fulfilled?

No. Completing an appropriate associate degree (or having the MACRAO-stamped transcript) will not guarantee that all general education requirements are fulfilled. You must speak with your academic adviser to determine which general education requirements can be fulfilled for your specific major or program.

How do I receive financial aid if I concurrently enroll?

Participants who choose to enroll at both Macomb and Wayne State in a semester must complete a student contract for that semester and will receive financial aid from Wayne State. Student contracts can be found online at finaid.wayne.edu.

If enrolled at both institutions, how can I verify my enrollment?

If you have registered for classes at both institutions, you must verify your enrollment at each institution separately. For full verification, contact the National Student Clearinghouse at www.studentclearinghouse.org.

Will Wayne State University automatically drop courses I've enrolled in at Wayne State, if payment is not received by the payment due date?

No. Wayne State University does not automatically drop courses for non-payment of tuition and/or fees. If a student decides not to attend Wayne State, courses should be dropped prior to or during the 100% tuition cancellation period.

FERPA Release

Students' educational information is released subject to the confidentiality provisions of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and other appropriate state and federal laws and regulations, which prohibit disclosure of educational information without the specific written consent of the person to whom it pertains or as otherwise permitted.

WayneDirect participants will authorize the sharing of educational and university directory information between Macomb Community College and Wayne State University as designated on the WayneDirect application.
